Report on the Eco-Friendly Clay Ganesha Idol Making Competition

Introduction

Objectives

The primary objectives of the competition were to:

- 2. Encourage creativity and craftsmanship among students.

- 4. Provide a platform for students to showcase their artistic talents.

Participation and Materials

- Day 1 (School Students):
 - The first day of the competition was open to students from Keshav Memorial High School.
 - o The competition was divided into two categories:
 - Category 1: Grades 5, 6, and 7
 - Category 2: Grades 8, 9, and 10
 - o Students showcased their creativity and artistic skills by crafting stunning Ganesha idols using eco-friendly materials like clay, seeds, and flowers.

• Day 2 (KMES Institutions):

- o The second day welcomed participants from all institutions under the KMES umbrella.
- o The competition had three categories for this diverse group:
 - Category 1: Intermediate and Undergraduate (UG)
 - Category 2: Postgraduate (PG)
- o This broader spectrum allowed students from various academic backgrounds to participate and express their artistic talents using eco-friendly methods.

Each participant was provided with 750 grams of eco-friendly clay and was allowed to use sculpting

tools, biodegradable decorations, and reference images. The use of non-toxic colors was permitted to ensure the safety and eco-friendliness of the idols. Participants were instructed to avoid harmful materials and stay true to the spirit of the event, which emphasized sustainability.

Judging Criteria

The idols were judged based on:

- Creativity
- Craftsmanship
- Sustainable approach

To ensure transparency and fairness, the judges were invited from Badruka College of Commerce & Arts, Kachiguda. The panel comprised of:

- Ms. Rashmi Dhodapkar, Assistant Professor
- Dr. Rakhee Renapurkar, Assistant Professor

Both judges brought extensive experience and a keen eye for artistic detail, ensuring that the evaluation process was impartial and thorough.
